General Report:

Following on from 'Celebrate Shelley' the Museum had also staged an impressive display highlighting the achievements of Shelley Community Association and the creation and development of the Hall over 50 years..thanks to the Museum and their roving reporters.

Cycle paths in Healey Greave Wood. Although only one official complaint has been made to us we understand there is unease amongst those who walk the woods on a regular basis. We were told that although it is lovely to see children active outside and their ingenuity is considerable the concern is the depth of their cycle runs on popular paths, the damage to the ancient woodland and habitat and the issue of expansion – the runs have escalated to attract motorized bikes. Martin Kenworthy of Safer Kirklees has been notified and a colleague has visited, we await feedback. Meanwhile if motorized bikes are seen then contact the Neighbourhood Policing Team by emailing Rural@westyorkshire.pnn.police.uk or call 101 and uninsured bikes can be seized.

Pensitone Line Rail Project We are to write to MP Jade Botterill to ask about progress. We are concerned there is still no disabled access to Platform One for trains to Sheffield.

Hanging Baskets We agreed to sponsor a double hanging basket down Far Bank as always. The Box planters that were cared for by John Keaveney are to be looked after by Ali Mettrick and Poppy Speight caring for the one near the bus stop and Trevor Flannery watering the one at the Triangle both on Huddersfield Road – our thanks to all involved with making Shelley colourful.

Village Hall Report Outside noticeboard has fallen apart – soon to be replaced and plaque on display – thanks to Carol.

Environment Report: SCEG has managed a few sessions recently clearing Cowgate path and the bench there, paths on the Bridle and benches there with some management of the trees negotiated. David also cut down all overhanging branches along Huddersfield Road. Many thanks to him and his team of SCEG for all their hard work.

Huddersfield Road was becoming over grown as it led from the Garden Centre to the College which has now been cleared by Kirklees following notification by Jill and Stephen and the Rec too has been cut by Kirklees. However Kirklees are way behind with grass cutting so it may be up to residents to make up the shortfall. Claire volunteered to tackle weeds on the Green. Bamboo on the Whins – Stephen Allen and Ann Priestman met with neighbours there kindly organized by Meg Dunford and Stephen reported to the meeting. The position of the Community Association is that we cannot interfere on Kirklees land without their permission and that this is not part of the Association's charitable remit, although it could be part of another group's. The neighbours were supplied with the name of the company which gave the quote for removal of the bamboo and it was stressed that it should be done professionally as bamboo is very hard to kill and can re-root from small pieces that are left or dropped so it must be removed by a specialist firm. They were also encouraged to contact Cllr John Taylor who has taken an interest in the bamboo.

Kirkburton Parish Council; A large grant is being awarded to Kirkburton and Highburton Community Association for the repair of potholes on the unadopted road near their Village Hall which the meeting agreed was a mess.

The Start of SCA and the opening of the Village Hall

When the old Church School was put up for sale, Kirkbuton Parish Council were persuaded to buy it and lease it to Shelley Community Association to use as a Village Hall. Formed on the 20th September 1976 the Association then had to set about raising the funds to convert the school.

People involved in those early years included Ian and Joan Mercer, Revd Arthur Beaumont, Barbara Wadsworth, Willie Meech, Robert Schofield, Jackie Fitches, Errol Shepherd, Hugh Stringer, John Hoyle, Carmen Heppenstall, Frank Wadsworth, Gerald Edinburgh and Susan Oldfield. The first Secretary was Len Hoare, Treasurer was Angus Shaw and Chairman was Jack Whitwam.

One of those involved at the start was Susan Oldfield who recalls her memories of those early years below:-

1970's Shelley was a much divided village. People at the top attended the Parish Church. The Methodist being the choice for people at the bottom. We never did mix. This I understand also happened in other parts of the country. The mammoth task of raising funds to convert the school into a village hall was a good thing and certainly brought the villagers together. Anyone who could raise a few pounds was roped in. Our target was to raise £10,000.

An early event was the New Years Day walk (Welly walk so named due to Wellington Boots being needed) which still runs to this day.

In order to make as much money as possible trades people, colleagues and friends gave us raffle prizes (Barbara Wadsworth and I worked together). We knitted dishcloths (courtesy of Shelley Textiles), sold firewood as most people still had open fires. We had sponsored slims and sponsored silences and yet more raffles with work colleagues remarking that surely we must have built Shelley Village Hall by now!

1978 May Day was declared a public holiday. I suggested we should have an event on that day. Greta Lockwood organised a may pole dance for the children and there were stalls selling various goods. The cash was flowing in from the stall holders and after a very tiring and successful day I had collected just over £1000 in my shoulder bag. A lot of money in the 1970s and a real boost to our funds.

Jacquie Fitches held a Coffee Day and Bring and Buy stall that was an outstanding success as all of Shelley seemed to come. Hectic is putting it mildly, with Ian Mercer and Gerald Hawthornthwaite being busy ferrying people to the top of Shelley. We also had a coffee morning at Shelley Hall courtesy of Mr and Mrs Neil Hudson which was again well attended.

Mrs Carmen Heppenstall of Shelley Woodhouse purchased goods at cost from Beaumonts warehouse, we both went to Yorks Purchasing in Wakefield to buy the first Brown and Yellow curtains for the Hall. By now we had more people on the committee bringing much needed help.

The Over60s was formed with Harry Barraclough the first Chairman followed by my father Harold Oldfield. Demand was so great initially that only people from Shelley could attend although later it was opened up to other villages. Initially many of the members were in their 70s and 80s. Due to Dad being involved I joined on reaching 60 and gradually many younger people were involved.

I stand to be corrected but this is my vision of life in 1970s Shelley.

KIRKLEES COUNCIL REPORT

Hello to all in Shelley.
At the time of writing (12th July) the impasse over the Leadership of Kirklees Council has still not been resolved. This is starting to become somewhat urgent, as the council is only partially functional in that the Chief Executive and his senior officer team are ensuring that essential services (including, sorry to say, the collection of Council Tax!) continue to operate, whilst anything of a political nature, including setting a budget, is on hold. Because, as I have said several times,

Kirklees has a "Strong Leader and Cabinet" mode of governance the council is also in breach of the law in that no elected executive is in place. Should that situation continue the Government will impose commissioners, which frankly would not be to the benefit of the people of the Borough. There is a Kirklees Council meeting on 15th July when, realistically, the leadership question will have to be resolved.

The custom in Kirklees is that the different political groupings each meet on the Monday evening before Full Council, and so it is that we 9 Conservatives will be discussing our collective position regarding the council Leadership question. To date we have stood back to allow the opportunity for the two largest groupings, Reform on the one hand and a coalition of Green Party, LibDems and various Independents on the other, to reach an accommodation on the Leadership question.

The signs are that they are still deadlocked and we Conservatives may have to favour one side or the other in order to allow Kirklees to move on. In that, we will be guided by what appears to represent the best interests of the people of Kirklees. I know, of course, which grouping I am likely to back but will listen to any arguments put forward in our meeting. Ultimately I believe strongly in collective responsibility, so will abide by whatever group decision is made.

Meanwhile, the burning question of the hour in Shelley, in Kirkburton Ward and in Kirklees is not connected to the Leadership squabbles. I refer, of course, to the (non-)cutting of municipal grass. The fact is that the council faced a double whammy. A/the (I'm not sure just how many machines KMC operates) large mower broke down and could not be repaired immediately. Meanwhile, of course, the grass grew relentlessly as did the volume of protests from the good folk of Shelley.

Coinciding with the loss of the machine, Parks experienced an unexpected spike in employee absences. The joint effect was that grass cutting was delayed, which meant that the machinery struggled to cope with the extra load it faced. In turn, this led to less than perfect results when grass was finally cut. Residents were, unsurprisingly, not impressed! And they said so, loudly.

Sunday 12th July saw the Shelley Gala, with a very impressive appearance by the weather Gods who were kind and generous. Bright and sunny with a nice breeze to keep things cool enough. It did seem to me that there were a couple of stalls less this year, but those staffing them were as bright and cheerful as ever. I was interested to

see what appeared to be a joint production by the Community Association and the Friday Friendship Cafe (FFC) – well the ladies wore identical tops and shared a gazebo. I am always cautious about singling out any particular group in the community, for they all do a lot of good, but I am particularly impressed by the FFC. This dementia-friendly organisation provides a meeting place for our older residents, often complete with entertainment and always with my particular favourite, delicious home baked cakes. The volunteers, mainly young lads and lasses in their 60s and 70s, are happy to use their own money to buy the cake ingredients and other incidentals, much to the chagrin of my Parish Council colleague Ray Bray. Ray keeps trying to persuade them to apply for grants, to which they would certainly be entitled. This being Shelley they value their independence!

PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

Our July Parish Council meeting was a low-key affair. The usual agenda items were discussed, and the meeting closed with no contentious issues. One thing of note which has been highlighted on social media is the new development in Highburton. The proposed development of 150 homes off Paddock Road in Highburton is currently in the pre-application phase. There is no formal planning application submitted to Kirklees Council, meaning no official consultations or council votes have taken place yet. Personally, I cannot see development for houses slowing down, developers develop that's what they do, and their aim is for more Green Belt land. We now have a Joker in the pack namely, Grey Belt land, and Grey Belt land refers to previously developed sites or poor quality scrubland within the protected Green Belt that makes a limited contribution to Green Belt purposes. To unlock land for housing, the government allows development on these areas provided developers meet strict "golden rules," such as including affordable housing and infrastructure. The issue is that the definition of Grey Belt is in itself very grey in its distinction.

I was surprised to read the recent letter (June issue) from a parish councillor claiming that Prime Minister Keir Starmer has "done nothing since day one." I think it is important that incorrect information is challenged.

People are, of course, entitled to disagree with the Government's priorities or oppose its policies. That is a normal and healthy part of democracy.

What is not healthy is replacing debate with slogans. To claim that the Government has done "nothing" is simply untrue.

Since taking office, the Government has passed legislation, introduced budgets, negotiated international agreements, major investment in the NHS, begun reforming the railways, increased workers' and renters' rights, expanded renewable energy projects, boosted affordable and social housebuilding, made friends with Europe again, more money for road repairs, kept us out of the Iran war, successfully strengthened border security measures and taken action on school standards and repairs, 10 million free school breakfasts so far, among many many other measures. Perhaps not what you see in many unfriendly national newspapers.

Readers may support those decisions or oppose them, but they cannot honestly pretend they do not exist.

Politics is at its best when we argue over facts and ideas rather than making sweeping statements that collapse under the slightest scrutiny.

Your readers deserve better than claims designed to generate outrage rather than inform. If we are to have a constructive conversation about the country's future, let's start from an agreed set of facts and then debate what they mean.

I encourage readers to look at the Government's actual record and make up their own minds—not on the basis of slogans, but on evidence.

Thursday the 25th June 2026 was a special day in Shepley. On this date 105 years ago Shepley War Memorial was unveiled, the siting of the memorial is quite strange. Others, including myself have thought that the memorial would have been located in the village centre, rather than across the local football pitch and into deep woodland with the nearest road being Firth Street by the tennis club. However, the village layout has changed in those 105 years what was once a good siting turns out not to be as well-placed as hoped.

Our gardens have been suffering with the lack of rainwater and my rain water butts are dry. I recently ordered two new water butts which I shall link together when I get time. They do say that rainwater is better for plants as tap water has been treated to make it fit for drinking. Rainwater is naturally soft, free of harsh treatment chemicals (like chlorine), and has a naturally acidic pH that helps plants absorb vital nutrients from the soil. Tap water is usually treated to be alkaline, to protect metal pipes, often pushing the pH above 8.0. Rainwater is naturally acidic, around 5.5 to 6.5, which is the exact sweet spot for most plants to absorb micronutrients. As rain falls, it captures atmospheric nitrogen, nitrates. This provides a natural, highly bioavailable nitrogen for our plant's foliage. Quick tip: If you don't have a rain barrel or are watering houseplants, you can still use tap

water effectively. Simply fill an open watering can and let it sit uncovered for 24 to 48 hours before using. This allows the chlorine and other volatile disinfectants to evaporate into the air, making it much safer for your plants.

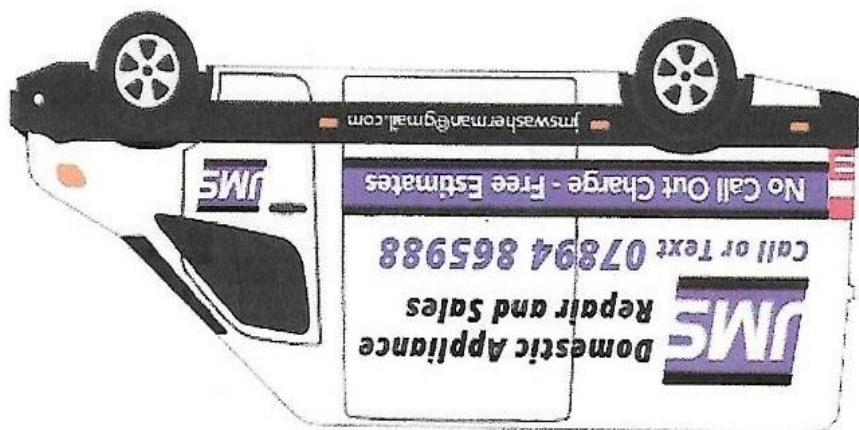

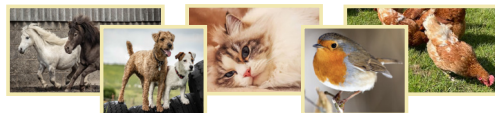

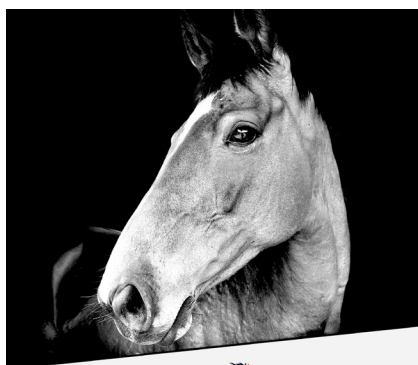
